A Safe Place Marks Domestic Violence Awareness Month with Book Talks and a Masked Gala

LAKE COUNTY, IL – The National Coalition Against Domestic Violence launched the first Domestic Violence Awareness month in October 1987 to celebrate survivors, mourn those who lost their lives due to violence, and connect those who work to end violence.

This October, A Safe Place, Lake County's sole provider of lifesaving services exclusively addressing domestic violence, is hosting three book talks around Lake County and hosting its 8th annual fundraising Gala to raise awareness and discuss how we can all prevent, intervene, and eliminate this epidemic in our communities.

The chosen book is a 1998 Oprah Book Club pick called "Black and Blue" by Anna Quindlen. A novel about a marriage that begins with passion and ends with violence, it is a perfect opportunity to discuss issues of equality, empowerment, and violence with our friends, families, and coworkers.

One in three women and one in seven men will experience rape, physical violence, and/or stalking by an intimate partner at some point in their lifetime.
