

### **THANK YOU!**



In 2022, **2,146 People** received assistance in obtaining orders of protection.



In 2022, 99 Families with 135 children received 974 custody exchanges and 747 Supervised Visitations.



In 2023, **124 Adults** and **160 Children** received **80,516**nights of safe transitional and permanent housing.



In 2023, **6,415 People** were reached through preventative educational presentations.



In 2022, **4,678 Callers** received support from our **24/7 Crisis Line**.



In 2022, 1,061 Adults and 465 Children received 33,695 hours of case management counseling, therapy, and art therapy.



In 2023, **237 Individuals** recived Abuser Intervention services.



Maya never imagined that her life would take such a dark turn. Once filled with dreams and hope, she found herself trapped in a dangerous cycle of domestic violence, and it wasn't just her own life at stake her daughter, Emma and their cat, Patch were depending on her to make the impossible decision to escape.

For months, Maya endured unimaginable trauma. Everyday she lived in fear, knowing that leaving could mean safety but also uncertainty. Finding shelter for her young doughter, herself and beloved cat was a bit of a challange. Patch was more than a cat, he was a source of comfort for Maya and her daughter.

Maya learned about A Safe Place through a friend, but hesitated at first, wondering if there would be room for her daughter and herself, but also making sure that Patches was able to stay with them as the thought of leaving Patch behind was nonnegotiable.

When Maya finally reached out to A Safe Place, she was relieved to discover that there was no need to choose between safety and their beloved cat. Through the Purple Leash Project, Maya, her daughter, and Patch were welcomed into a safe, compassionate space where they could begin to heal together.

A Safe Place provided everything Maya needed to rebuild her life: housing, legal support and counseling, that allowed her to keep the three of them together which brought constant source of comfortand they were able to sleep peacefully for the first time in years. Because of the support of A Safe Place, Maya was able to create a new life for her and her daughter with Patch by their side, a gentle reminder of the love that held them together during their hardest times.

### 1978

Incorporated as Lake County Crisis **Center for Domestic Violence** Prevention and Treatment. DBA A Safe Place.



### 1979

Opened the first emergancy shelter for victims and children.



Opened second emergency shelter with 33 beds to serve victims of domestic violence.



### 1987

Launches the first program dedicated to abusers on their path to change.



### 1980

Intergrated 24-hour crisis call center, with on-site counselors.



### 2005

Approved by Illinois Board of Education for teacher certification units.



### 2006

Welcomed first family moves into new transitional housing for survivors and children.



### 2014

Implemented Sanctuary Model and Family Therapy agency-wide.



### 2011

Subsidized permanent housing with on-site support services.



### 2010

Opened Family Visitation Center for supervised visits and custody exchanges.



### 2015

Teamed up with Noah's Rest, becomes health navigator site, develops Life Skills Training Center, and launches Betty Toser Support Groups.



### 2016

Launched La Paloma program for Latina immigrants and holds first symposium for Partnership for a Safer Lake County.



2017

Introduced transitional housing, launches Safe Youth/Safer Lake County initiative, and becomes DV education trainer.



### 2018

Established Lake Forest office and becomes Illinois's only DCFS partner for comprehensive support services.



### 2019

Implimented rapid Rehousing for permanent housing, expanded services for human trafficking victims, and enhanced Crisis Response program.



### 2020

Remained fully operational during the COVID-19 pandemic.



### 2023

Secured a grant to initiate a Pet Shelter.
